Event Operations



- Each Team will be greeted at Ottawa International Airport www.ottawa-airport.ca by the Football Canada Welcoming Committee.
- The YOW shuttle will transport teams to Carleton University Accommodations.
- Each team will check-in and receive a Team Kit the University. The check-in desk is open 24 hours per day.



- 15 Fields within a 2 kilometer radius of accommodations will be used including RA Centre, Brewer Park and Carleton University.
- The YOW shuttle buses will be scheduled throughout the day to service each location two hours before the first competition of the day to one hour after the last.



- Players and Team staff will have access to Athletic Therapists and Physiotherapists on fields during practice and game times.
- Water and/or sports drinks will be available at all fields as will shade area (canopy tents).
- A complete list of medical centres and clinics and emergency protocols will be incorporated into Welcome kits.

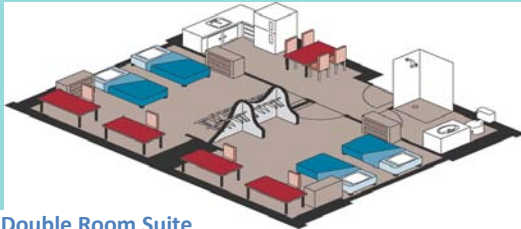

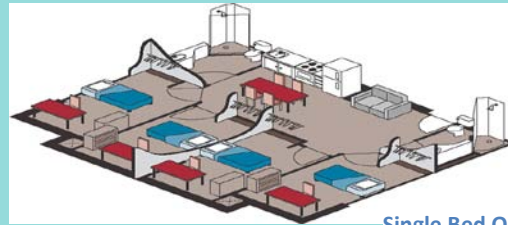

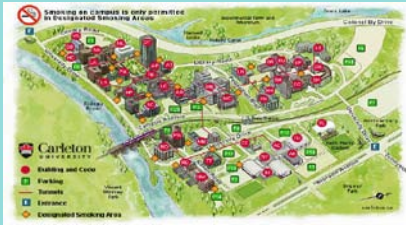

Each team will be asked to assign a Team Manager within their team to be the main contact with Football Canada.) This person will be the main contact before the tournament and onsite.

Upon registration at arrival, each team member will be required to show a government issued passport or government accepted document that includes photograph, date of birth and nationality. Male players must be 18 or older by the first day of competition and Female players must be 16 or older by the first day of competition. Each team member will then be given a lanyard with an event pass including their picture. Each event pass must be presented to game officials along with the official roster before playing each game. Please see the "Regulations of the 5th IFAF Flag Football World Championship 2010" for further information.

Each team will be provided with 2 VIP passes to the Outaouais Room at the RA Centre. This room will be reserved for IFAF executives, team coaches and/ or managers as well as any special guests to network.

Ceremonies

Parade of Countries will kick-off the award presentations immediately following the Championship game. Individual medals and team trophies will be presented to the top three teams in the men's and women's categories.
